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Activity Analysis Example Occupational Therapy

Occupational therapy students role play an OT working with a patient with a traumatic brain injury on making sandwiches for school lunches. Students demonstrate a task analysis of sweeping a floor. A woman demonstrates sorting medications and placing them in a pill organizer.

Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADLs) - Pass The OT

The preparation of the analysis includes a discussion of areas in which improvement is possible and how to approach that improvement. For example, the activity analysis might point out that widgets could be better packaged by robotic equipment than human workers.
