Rule 702. Testimony by Expert Witnesses | Federal Rules of ...

The court should provide a private waiting area for you until it is your time to testify. This area should be away from the witnesses for the defense. Unless directed by the court, it is not necessary to disclose your personal information such as address or employment information.

Opinion or expert testimony is permitted only if the court declares a witness to be an expert in a specified field. The declaration is made after the witness is sworn in and before testifying.
